3 Minutes

- 3.1 Minutes of the Full Council Meeting held 27th January 2025 were approved as an accurate record **RESOLVED:** Members approved.

The clerk advised members the updated 'larger grants' form will be shared, and it was suggested the form is sent to organisations soon to allow them to become familiar with the form and requirements. Members agreed the return date will be end of August to allow time to apply, with grants to be awarded as normal at the grants evening. It was also agreed that any grant requests of £1000 and over are required to complete an application form, anything less to be agreed as core funding.

5. Presentations & Representations

5.1 **CSO James Llewellyn (Llanyrafon)– Gwent Police**

Members were advised that a Llanyrafon Police Surgery would be held in Llanyrafon Methodist Church on 25th February, and monthly thereafter. Members suggested that locations were alternated monthly as some residents may have difficulties attending due to mobility, and that alternating with another venue may benefit residents across Llanyrafon. Members queried a police surgery for Croesyceiliog and was advised that Croesyceiliog's CSO Alex Rouf would be attending March FC meeting and to suggest setting up a Croesyceiliog ward surgery. CSO James Llewellyn also advised members that the speed gun is available to be used in locations across Croesyceiliog and Llanyrafon to target speeding, members suggested areas including The Highway, and that any further suggestions could be shared via email. Further discussions related to suggesting residents to ensure work vans are secured to avoid opportunistic theft, and members sought advice regarding parking legalities to ensure any advice shared with residents relating to parking, such as outside The Post Room, is beneficial. Members were advised to liaise with Cllr J Gauden and Cllr R Clark who can clarify parking advice with parking enforcement officers.

- Cllr N Davies advised members that CCYP are holding an open day on Wednesday for children, young people and their families, and that 2 additional open days will be held the following week for local organisations and stakeholders and that everyone is welcome to attend
- Cllr V Crick shared a report to members prior to the meeting regarding Crownbridge Estyn Report who's visit coincided with the school's inclusive pantomime and were delighted with the inspection. Members were advised that the school has opened a café Monday to Friday 11am-2pm which provides work experience for children at the school and will be opening up for children within the community who have an interest in cooking. Members agreed to send a letter of congratulations to the school following their Estyn report.
- Cllr C Crick advised members that Torfaen Museum Trust have submitted a new application to TCBC to support their new outreach services which will be a tremendous way forward. They are hoping funding will be increased as there is a significant increase in the SLA, and that the museum will also approach CLCC and CCC to request financial support for a project proposal.
- Members suggested the Clerk contact TCBC regarding committee meetings relating to Greenmeadow Community Farm as works are progressing and will be opening later this year.
